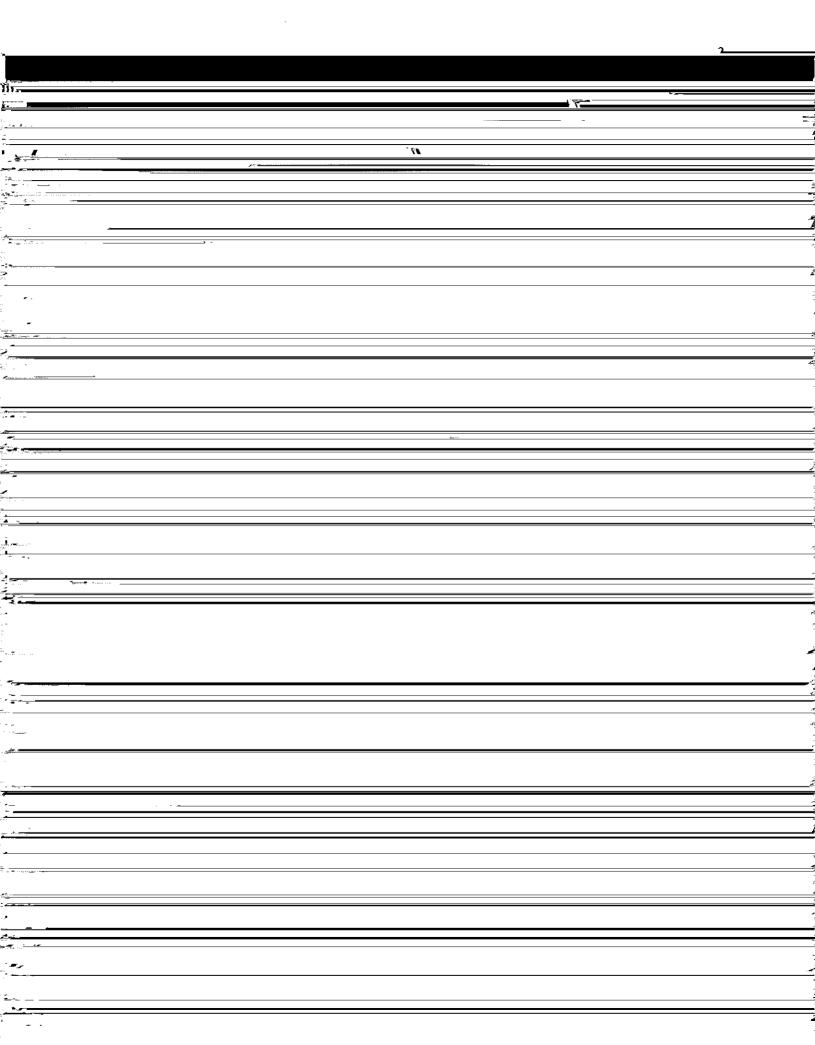
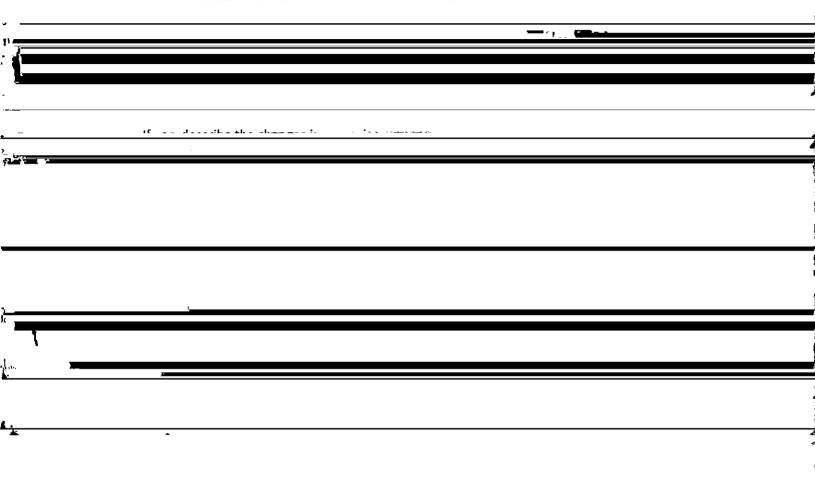

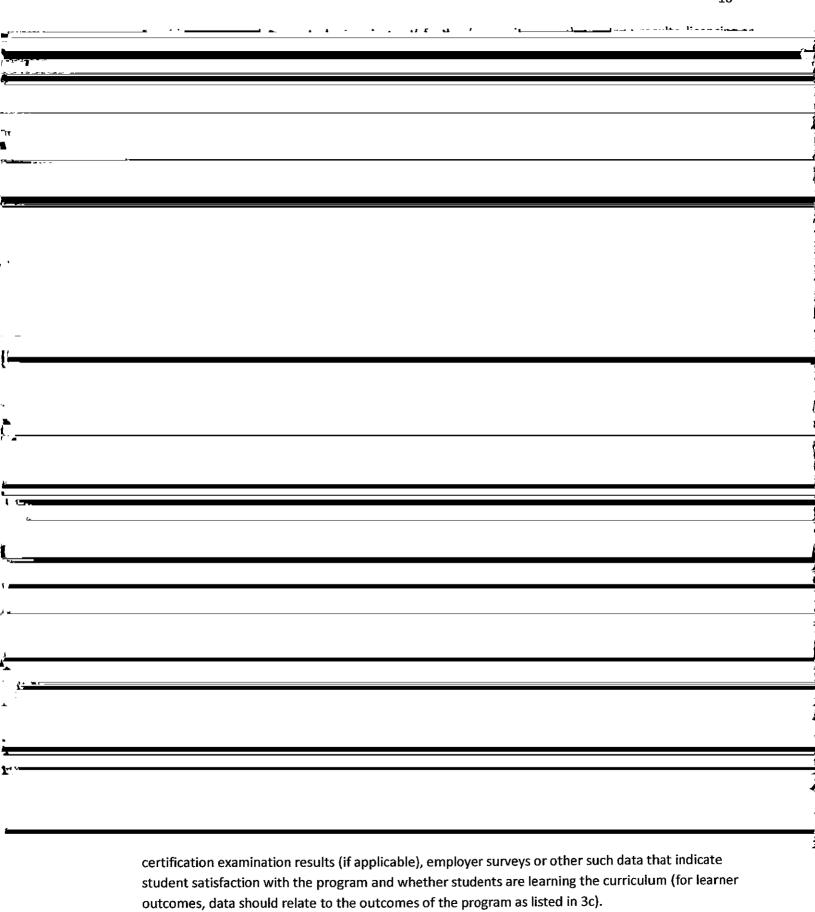

In that same round of curriculum revisions, the faculty approved the addition of another large lecture course, Comm 130: Communication and Society, and designation of that course as fulfilling an introductory general education requirement. All of those curricular changes were approved by Academic Affairs and the results should be evident in the next round of reviews

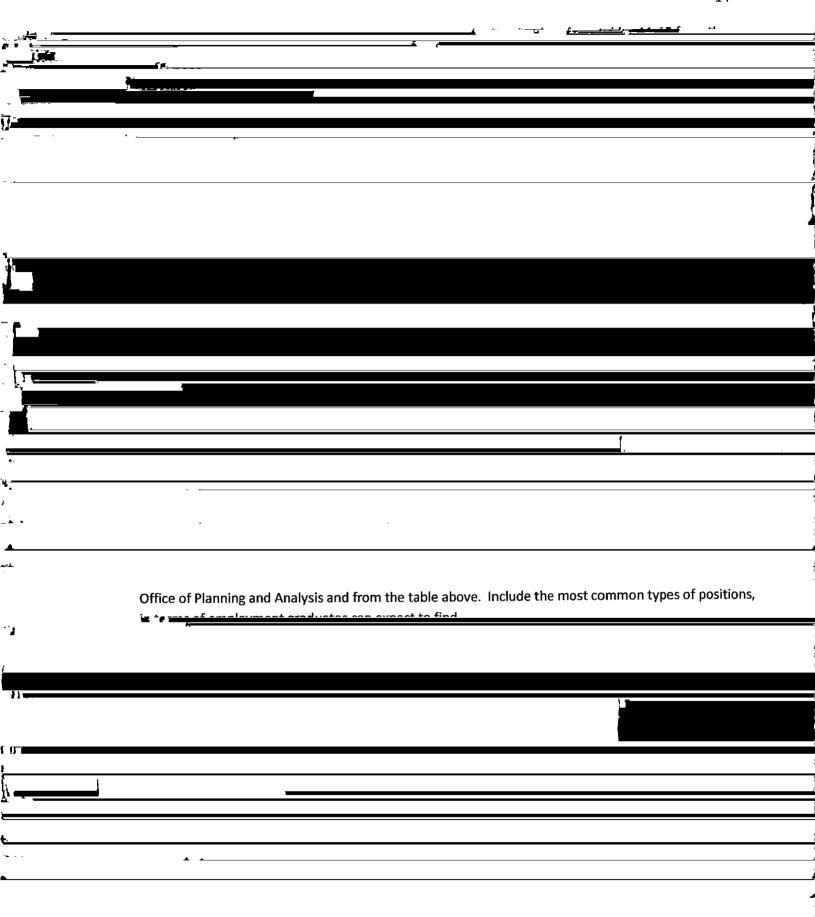
