Our whole unit was required to attend a sexual harassmenta wareness presentation that appeared informational in nature but suggested literior motives. All attention should have been solely directed at the person in question. The individual in question should have been dealt with discretely and directly. It was none of my business. I did not need to be there."
- x "Neverheardwhat the outcomewas."
- x "[As a third party reporter], I was given insufficient information and each time was told that because the [Respondent] refused to participate in the process, there was nothing they could do."

# Individual Follow Up Conversations

Sixteenemployees(3.2% of employeesurveyrespondents) expressed interest in being contacted to sharemore about their experiences. The following broad them esemerged from those individual conversations:

- x Severalemployeeswere unfamiliar with OIECand the personnelwho work there. Those employeesexpressed that they would appreciate more opportunities to learn about OIECso that they are more comfortable making referrals to OIEC.
- x Many employeesexpressed the belief that the University community would benefit from required foundational OIE Craining and education across populations. Several employees said that a foundational training would allow their department or program to host more specific program to address the unique context and needs of their unit.
- x Someemployeeswho havemade third party reports on behalf of others expressed desire to have some communication about next steps, such as a message stating, "Thankyou for making a report to OIEC. We have connected with the person on whose behalf you reported and we look forward to continuing to work with them. To protect the privacy interests of the parties, we will not share case updates with you; however, we encourage you to continue to be in touch with the person on whose behalf you reported."
- x Employeeswould like clearerguidanceand additional tools for how to address concerns that do not constitute OIEC prohibited conduct and/or are found not to rise to the level of a potential policy violation under OIEC spolicies. As examples, employees cited harassment not based on a protected class, in appropriate expectations for work performance or hours, disrespectful comments about others in the workplace, and bullying.
- x Employeeswho haveserved as advisors for others going through the OIE Oprocess noted the need for more training and better communication about the hearing format. They also noted the need for additional resources to prepare them to serve in the role of advisor.
- x Someemployeesreported the needfor better training and more consistentenforcement of the responsible mployeereporting obligation. One employees aid that their supervisor told them not to report their concerns OIEC.
- x Some employees said they felt that OIEC was unable to explain its own policies and procedures.
- x Someemployeessaid that OIECstaff minimized their experiences by offering alternative explanations or another person's conduct that focused on the other person's possible intentrather than the impact on the employee reporting the conduct.
- x Somemployeesnoted that, in their interactions with OIE & taff, they have found the staff to be proactive, engaged, dedicated, and resource fulin finding ways to help students. Those employees noted the need for increased resources for OIE Cand other units that address discrimination and harassment.
