



## 2+2 Articulation Agreement Between

Wichita State University and Butler Community College

March 27, 2019

The purpose of this 2+2 agreement is to provide students the opportunity to transfer one course worth credit from Butler Community College to Wichita State University.

This agreement is for students who:

- Earned an Associate of Arts (A.A.) or Associate of Science (A.S.) degree
- Achieved a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0
- Applied for admission to WSU

Butler students meeting the following:

- Be guaranteed admission to WSU with completion of application requirements and receipt of transcripts
- Enter with junior standing
- Be guaranteed to transfer all credits (100 level and above) exceeding 6 credits from Butler with earned grade of C or better.

Students can inquire about a degree and plan to complete a bachelor's degree by contacting the WSU Financial Aid Office (316) 322-6101.

For graduation from WSU with Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science degree, students will need to fulfill transfer coursework toward degree requirements and fulfill degree requirements for graduation as outlined by WSU.

Students transferring to WSU from Butler must meet the necessary requirements for admission to WSU and will be evaluated on an individual basis.
