2+2 Articulation Agreement

Between

Wichita State University (WSU) and Butler Community College

The purpose of this 2+2 agreement is to provide Butler Community College students the opportunity to transfer credit to WSU in pursuit of a baccalaureate degree with a major in social work.

This agreement is for Butler Community College students who:

- Earned an Associates of Arts (A.A.) or Associates of Science (A.S.) degree
- Achieved a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0
- Applied for admission to WSU

Butler Community College students meeting the above criteria will:

- Be guaranteed admission to WSU with concurrent enrollment and receipt of transcripts
- Enter with junior status and a baccalaureate degree
- Be guaranteed to complete all remaining (120) hours of requirements to complete a degree from Butler Community College with an earned grade of a C or better

For graduation from WSU with the Social Work degree, students will need to fulfill transfer coursework from Butler Community College, meet all requirements for graduation as outlined by WSU.


Students transferring to WSU from Butler Community College must meet the necessary requirements for admission to WSU. All transcripts will have their transcript evaluated on an individual basis.
